




Building Brighter Tomorrow with Good Habits- Grade 5 Spreads the Power of Positivity!

The vibrant performances and thoughtful messages left everyone inspired and reminded students that good habits aren't just rules—they are stepping stones to a better version of ourselves.


It was a celebration of values, a boost of motivation, and a shining example of how positive habits can light the path ahead!















Shining Stars Honored: Scholar Badge Ceremony
