

Essence of English Language

As an integral part of the learning process, work education involves purposeful and meaningful work performed by the students that are useful to society, as well as providing the satisfaction of achieving personal fulfilment. It was the theme of Figurative Language that inspired Work Education this month. Literature and communication rely heavily on figurative language. The freedom to express ideas creatively and imaginatively is the main element of any figurative language. Keeping the same ethos in mind an array of activities were organised for Grades 1 and 2 children. It was the first time the children were exposed to idioms, and they came to understand that literal meaning differs greatly from what the words actually mean. Some common idioms were taught to the children through a PowerPoint presentation which enabled them to understand that Idioms not only enhance their vocabulary, but also their notion of expression. It adds humour and interest to the conversation, making it more engaging for the listener. In the second activity, children acted as objects as part of personification play. Each child came up with a unique idea of expression, and their efforts were appreciated by one and all. The personification play lit a creative spark in students, helping them become more imaginative thinkers.









Spelling On-the-Go

Learning a language is the foremost step in the life of a child as it helps them to communicate with the world and school plays a vital role in training the child in this direction. To enhance the language proficiency and vocabulary of our little learners, DPS GBN organised the Spell-a-thon activity for Grade 2 children. Spellathon requires students to identify the words and spell them out in different conditions with varying difficulty levels. It is a good way to improve pronunciation and enrich vocabulary. Preparing for Spellathon helped students to understand words more deeply as they learnt definitions, language of origin or etymology, usage in a sentence, along with the spelling of words. Grade 2 children keenly participated in the activity and memorized the words of 'ou' and 'ew' sounds. They were quizzed based on these sounds. Each child performed amazingly well. This initiative aimed not only at fostering linguistic skills but also enhancing their listening skills. Indeed, this activity provided an interesting doorway for students to inculcate love for words, to challenge their limits, take pride in their efforts and explore their linguistic mettle.
